<sup>1</sup>Clearance: A crime is cleared or "solved" for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to the court for prosecution or cited by juvenile authorities. In certain situations, a crime may be cleared by "exceptional means." An exceptional clearance is when the police investigation has definitely established the identity of the offender, has enough information to support an arrest, and the exact location of the offender is known, but for some reason is unable to take the offender into custody.

<sup>2</sup>Clearance rate: A clearance rate is the percentage of crimes reported that have been cleared.
